

CAREERS POLICY ENTITLEMENT STATEMENT

HIGH STORRS SCHOOL

Careers education underpins much of our teaching at High Storrs. In addition to careers lessons delivered through PSCHEE lessons, we are developing a clear focus on employability skills across each subject and students are encouraged to make links between these skills and their relevance to the world of work.

Regular careers education is integral to our form time provision across KS3-5, ensuring we deliver a clear, whole-school careers focus across each of the tutor groups at every key stage.

In addition, KS5 deliver an established careers programme through their weekly Tutorials.

'Career of the Week'

Produced weekly and shared on the digital signage and the school's social media platforms, it is promoted in subjects where there is a clear link to that subject and regularly shared in form time.

Careers Week

Rather than delivering an annual whole-school careers week, each department identifies one week within the school year that is most appropriate for their subject and organises a themed subject careers week across all year groups. This may include inviting guest speakers, investigating future careers and

participation in project-based tasks. This enables regular access to specific careers guidance

Personal Guidance


Ruth Mellors, from Sheffield Futures, provides independent personal guidance to all High Storrs pupils for two days a week.

- · In KS3, students may be invited for a 1:1 or group interview at key points in the year
- · In KS4,1:1 guidance is provided to all students
- · In KS5, 1:1 guidance is provided to all students who request it

Unifrog

Unifrog is a careers platform used from Y7 to Y13 which allows our students to explore information on many of the pathways available to them at each stage of their educational journey. Students are able to investigate a variety of careers available in the world of work, then research information about qualifications and experience they may need, including local and national LMI. Our Careers Team are able to monitor and provide support based on the information students and teachers input into Unifrog, which is mapped against the Gatsby Benchmarks.

We use Gatsby Benchmarks to help us evaluate our careers' provision. These are criteria provided to schools to help them in the delivery of careers education and are a measure which could be used by Ofsted when carrying out an inspection.
