GCSE English results – Y11 class of 2023

- Grade $7+ \rightarrow 40\%$
- Grade $5+ \rightarrow 89\%$
- Grade $4+ \rightarrow 96\%$

Average difference from national progress target = +0.6



GCSE English Language (AQA)

Paper 1

- Reading fiction & descriptive or narrative writing
- One story extract to read, and four questions to answer
- 45 minutes to write a narrative or a piece of description

Building on knowledge & understanding of Literature

Paper 2

- Reading non-fiction & opinion writing
- Two non-fiction texts to read, and four questions to answer
- 45 minutes to write a piece of persuasive writing

The reading questions are formulaic – the same marks and skills are tested each time.

E.g. for Paper 1, Q1 is always comprehension, Q2 always language analysis, etc.

Students will be taught and should learn a formula for approaching the exam: how long to spend on each question, how many marks each is worth, and what they should include in their answer.

Designed for Success

<u>Tips for success – English Language</u>

- Practise each question and learn the formula for success.
 As well as class and homework, do extra papers at home.
- Focus on feedback and use assessments as an opportunity to improve.
- Read widely across a variety of texts (fiction and nonfiction): Classics, modern fiction, autobiography, poetry, opinion and feature articles.
- Be organised and complete homeworks early, including extra reading set via Satchel One.
- Build a varied and ambitious vocabulary.

GCSE English Literature (AQA)

(the top four groups are taking English Literature in Y11)

- ✓ Revision lesson once per week
- ✓ Guided revision homework
- ✓ Learn quotes and key ideas early, then focus on essay writing / exam questions

Paper 1

- Shakespeare play *Macbeth*
- 19th Century Novel *A Christmas Carol* or *Jekyll and Hyde* depending on group

Paper 2

- Modern text DNA or An Inspector Calls or Lord of the Flies depending on group
- Poetry Anthology Power and Conflict
- Unseen poetry

(Those who have already gained Literature GCSE will spend all lessons working on Language skills)



<u>Tips for success – English Literature</u>

- Re-read the texts and learn key quotes.
- Focus on feedback and use assessments as an opportunity to improve.
- Read around the texts essays and podcasts about them, plus other work by the same author.
- Consider themes and ideas in the text, and link all language analysis to these – what is the writer showing us through these characters and events?
- Develop your personal interpretations and argue these in your essays using evidence from the texts.

- Teachers will direct students to other resources online.
- Teachers will set regular directed revision tasks.
- Past papers can be found on the AQA website and are useful for practice – pupils will also be given sample papers and questions by teachers.
- There are many useful videos on Youtube: e.g. Mr Bruff, BBC Teach, AQA. Myshakespeare.com is useful for *Macbeth*.

The November trial exams will be Paper 2 for Language and Paper 1 for Literature.

Pathways

- Exam board for Science = AQA
- Students follow either Triple Science (x3 GCSEs)
 pathway or Combined Science (x2 GCSES) pathway.
- Both pathways provide access to A level Sciences.
 - Every year students move successfully into A level Science having studied Combined Science.
- Pathways are reviewed after mocks in November.
 - There are usually a few pathway and tier changes.

Combined Science

- 2 GCSE results at the end of Y11.
- Sit 6 exams:
 - 2 x Biology, 2 x Chemistry, 2 x Physics.
- Each paper is 1 hr and 15 mins
- The scores for all the papers are added together.
- This score gives an overall grade.
- Grade examples:
 - 8 | 8 (two grade 8s), 6 | 5 (one grade 6 and one grade 5)
- Higher tier: Can achieve grades 9|9 to 4|3.
- Foundation tier: Grades 5 | 5 to 1 | 1.



GCSE Science Structure

Triple Science

- 3 separate GCSE results awarded at the end of Y11.
- Sit 6 exams:
 - 2 x Biology, 2 x Chemistry, 2 x Physics.
- Each paper is 1 hr and 45 mins.
- Biology, Chemistry and Physics
- Higher tier: Can achieve grades 9 to 4.
- Foundation tier: Can achieve grades 5 to 1.



Trial Exams

Each set of trial exams covers <u>half of the GCSE</u> courses that are assessed in the Summer.






Combined Science

What do these results mean?

Triple: On average students are least 1.4 grades above target levels.

Combined: On average 0.3 grades above target levels.
